LEADING FACTS OF FRENCH HISTORY

ONTGOMERY'S histories have earned an enviable reputation. As schoolbooks they are extremely popular, since they are at once scholarly and highly interesting. At the same time, the general reader cannot fail to be impressed by the masterly way in which Mr. Montgomery handles his subject.

The object of this volume is to present the most important events of the history of France, selected, arranged, and treated according to the soundest principles of historical study, and set forth in a clear and attractive narrative.

The work is based on the highest French authorities, — Guizot, Rambaud, Martin, and Duruy, —and all points demanding special consideration have been carefully compared with the views of the best English writers on France.

The attention of teachers is called especially to the following summary.

The respective influences of the Celtic race and of the Roman and the German conquests and occupations of Gaul are clearly shown.

Charlemagne's work and the subsequent growth of feudal institutions are next considered.

The breaking up of the feudal system, with the gradual consolidation of the provinces into one kingdom, and the development of the sentiment of nationality are traced and illustrated.

The growth of the absolutism of the crown, the interesting and important relations of France to America, and the causes of the French Revolution are adequately presented.

The career of Napoleon and its effects on France and Europe are

carefully examined.

Finally, a sketch is given of the stages of the historical progress of France in connection with the state of the Republic to-day. This includes the Dreyfus case, the Act of Association, etc., bringing the history down to the year 1903.

The eleven full-page illustrations and the numerous maps add appreciably to the attractiveness of the volume.

In this thorough revision of a widely used text-book particular attention has been given to the leading political features, to questions of constitutional history, and to the opening and settlement of the West and its influence on the development of the nation. New maps and illustrations have been added, and the system of cross references has been extended.

The "Student's American History" is more than a mere record of events. It is a philosophical treatment of the rise and development of the nation both socially and politically. It is as attractive in style and as interesting in its manner of statement as the earlier books by this author, and is excellently adapted for the use of advanced students. Especial attention is given to the political and constitutional phases of the subject. Emphasis is laid on cause and effect as illustrated in American history, numerous facsimiles of original documents are shown, and nearly fourteen hundred references to other authorities are cited. The last impression of the book includes a list of important decisions of Chief Justice Marshall and an account of the accession of President Roosevelt.
