SUPRE'MO, *ma*, *soo-pray-mo*, *rah*, *a.* Supreme; highest, most excellent, paramount; excessive.

SUPRESIO'N, *soo-pres-se-on'*, *sf.* Suppression; obstruction; extinction.

SUPRESO, *sa*, *soo-pres'-eo*, *rah*, *pp. irr.* of SUPRIMIR. Suppressed.

SUPRESOR, *soo-pres-sore'*, *sm.* (Littl. us.) Suppressor.

SUPRIMIR, *soo-pre-mier'*, *va. 1.*

To suppress, to impede, to obstruct. 2. To abolish a place or employment, to extinguish. 3. To suppress, to keep in, to omit, to conceal.

SUPRI'OR, *ra*, *soo-pre-ore'*, *ah*, *a.* Sub-prior, sub-priress.

SUPRIORATO', *soo-pre-or-ab-toe*, *sm.* Office of sub-prior or priress.

SUPUESTO, *soo-poo-est-toe*, *sm.* 1. Supposition. 2. (Phil.) Individuality of a complete and incommutable substance.

SUPUE'STO, *ta*, *a.* and *pp. irr.* of SUPONER. Suppositions, supposative, supposed. *Supuesto que*, Allowing that, granting that; since.

SUPURACION', *soo-poor-ahh-e-on'*, *sf.* Suppuration.

SUPURA'NTE, *soo-poor-an'-tay*, *pa.* Supurating, generating pus.

SUPURA'R, *soo-poor-ah'-i*, *va. 1.*

To waste or consume moisture by heat. 2. (Surg.) To suppurate, to form pus. 3. (Met.) To dissipate, to evaporate; to lavish.

SUPURATIVO, *va*, *soo-poor-ahh-teel'-oo*, *rah*, *a.* Suppurative.

SUPURATO'RI, *ria*, *soo-poor-ahh-tor'-eo*, *ah*, *a.* Digestive, that which supurates.

SUPUTACION', *soo-poo-tuth-e-on'*, *sf.* Computation, calculation, supputation.

SUPUTA'R, *soo-poo-tar'*, *va.* To compute, to calculate, to suppose.

SUR, *soor*, *sm.* South; south wind. *Naregar al sur*, (Nau.) To steer a southerly course; to stand to the southward.

SURA', *soor-ah*, *sf.* Fibula, a bone of the leg.

SURAT, *soor-ah'l*, *a.* Sural: applied to the veins that run down the calf of the leg.

SURCA'DOR, *ra*, *soor-ahh-dore*, *ah*, *s.* Ploughman, plougher.

SURCA'R, *soor-car'*, *va. 1.* To furrow, to make furrows with a plough. 2. (Met.) To furrow, to flute. 3. To pass through a liquid.

*Surcar los mares*, (Nau.) To plough the seas.

SURCI'R, *soor-thier'*, *va.* (Obs.) To darn. V. ZURCIR.

SURCO, *soor-co*, *sm.* 1. Furrow, hollow track. 2. Line, wrinkle. A' surco, Applied to pieces of ground furrowed in the middle.

SURCULA'DO, *da*, *soor-coo-lah-doe*, *dah*, *a.* Applied to plants of one stem without branches.

SURCULO, *soor-coo-lo*, *sm.* Single stem of a tree or plant without branches.

SURCULOSO, *sa*, *soor-coo-lo'-so*, *rah*, *a.* Applied to a plant which has only one stem.

SURGE'NTE, *soor-hen'-tay*, *pa.* Surging, salient.

SURGIDERO, *soor-he-der'-o*, *sm.* Road, port, anchoring-place.

SURGIDO'R, *soor-he-dore'*, *sm.*

He who anchors.

SURGIT, *soor-hier'*, *va. 1.* (Nau.) To anchor. 2. To surge. 3. V.

SURTIR, *soor-ee'-ah*, *sf.* Ancient kind of Syrian cloth.

SURTIDA'D, *soor-tee'-dah*, *sf. 1.* (Fort.) Sallyport. 2. Sally, sortie.

3. Back-door.

SURTIDERO, *soor-te-der'-o*, *sm.* Country abounding in grain. *Surtido de trigo*. Public granary.

SUSPIRICO, *illo*, *iro*, *soos-peer-ee'-co*, *sm. dim.* A slight sigh or groan.

SUSCEPTIBILIDAD, *soos-theh-teh-bl'-eh-dad'*, *sf.* Susceptibility.

SUSCEPCION, *soos-theh-thieh-on'*, *sf.* Susception, the act of taking.
