

## UNIVERSITY OF NUEVO LEON

### HISTORY

The University of Nuevo Leon exists as an educational Corporation since 1933, with one interruption, by reasons of a political order, from 1934 to 1943, in which year it was substituted by a Board of Higher Culture. Since 1943, the University was restored by a Decree of the Local Congress of the State of Nuevo León, which rules now as its Organic Law.

The Schools and Faculties which at present integrate the University, date back from the most diverse periods. The Faculty of Law was founded, within the State Seminary, in 1824; the Faculty of Medicine and the Civil College, (now Called Preparatory School), were founded in 1856; the Faculty of Chemistry and Pharmacy (now called Chemical Sciences) was inaugurated in 1933; School of Engineering in the same year; the Preparatory Night School in 1937; the Institute for Scientific Research and the Department of University Social Action in 1943, and the Summer School in 1946.

The first provisional Rector of the University was don Pedro de Alba, M. D. (1933); after him the University has been ruled by don Hector Gonzalez, LI D 1933-34), don Angel Martinez Villarreal, M. D. (1934), Professor Gregorio Morales Sánchez (1935-36), and don Enrique C. Livas, M. D., as President of the Board of Higher Culture, from 1936 to 1943, and with character of Rector of this University from November 20, 1943 up to this day.

The University of New Leon was founded in 1933, on the initiative of the teachers and students of the Schools of Medicine, Law, School for Teachers, and the Civil College, by don Francisco A. Cardenas, governor of the State at this time, being Secretary of Public Education don Narciso Bassols, LI D, and President of the Republic General Abelardo L. Rodríguez. The restauration of the University in 1943 is due to General Bonifacio Salinas Leal, governor of the State at that time; and its solemn inauguration to don Arturo B. de la Garza, LI. D., at present governor of the State, on

November 20, 1943; being this year the XXXIII Anniversary of the Mexican Revolution.

The University consists at present of the following schools: Faculty of Law and Social Sciences, Faculty of Medicine, Faculty of Chemical Sciences, Faculty of Engineering with a School of Architecture Annex, Faculty of Dentistry, School for Nurses, an Annex to the Faculty of Medicine, Incorporated School for Accounts, School of Music, School of Arts and Crafts for Women "Pablo Livas", Industrial and Preparatory Technological School "Alvaro Obregón," Preparatory School, Preparatory Night School, Summer School, Institute of Scientific Research, and Department of University Social Action.

The authority in the University is exercised by the University Board, which is a Corporation formed by the Directors of the Schools and Faculties, Institutes and Departments, the Director of Education of the State, a professor who is elected by the Board of Teachers of each department and five representatives of the Students Federation of the University of Nuevo Leon, and by the Rector of the University, who is also Chairman of the Board.

The Summer School depends upon the Department of Social Action of the University.

The normal Courses are given in the University of Nuevo Leon from September to May of the following year, the months of June and August being devoted to ordinary and extraordinary examinations and recesses are decreed by the University Board.

The Summer School functions during the months of July and August of each year.

### SUMMER SCHOOL

Established in the year 1946, the Summer School of the University aims at extralimiting its educational functions in this season of the year, calling to its bosom, university elements, singularly foreign, as well as irregular students. Its activities are based on the subjects which more efficiently contrive in giving a fair and accesible odea of the Mexican Culture in the historic, sociological, artistic, and literary aspects, withuot overlooking the ordinary knowledge of the academic subjects of the University.

In the literary sense, for example, Courses on Mexican Literature will be given, from its origin up to this day; a course on local literature, called Letters of Nuevo Leon, and one on Cervantine Literature, which answers the purpose of celebrating the fourth Centennial of

the birth of Miguel de Cervantes Saavedra, Prince of the Spanish Letters.

The Courses on Archeology, Anthropology and History of old Mexico contain in their objective material the Exposition of Pre Spanish Art, the National Museum of Mexico which displays the most representative works of art to the high Mexican Cultures (gold jewels, quartz, basalt, alabaster, carved wood, and jade), together with Lectures which will be given by Mr. Ignacio Marquina, engineer, Director of the National Institute of Anthropology, Mr. Daniel F. Rubin de la Borbolla, M. D. Director of the National Museum, and Mr. Salvador Toscano, Ll. D., prominent critic who is also Secretary of the Institute.

Thanks to the cooperation of the Department of Plastic Arts of the Department of Public Education, the University presents the exposition of the pictorial work of Saturnino Herrán.

There will be, at the same time, interesting Lectures referring to the new idea of the modern Mexican Plastic, illustrated by cinematographic pictures and a series of Lectures on the History of Architecture, in the successive aspects: preSpanish, colonial and contemporary.

The Medical Science Department is devoted to present theoretic-practical Courses for post graduates on the most popular knowledge on modern therapeutics, as Gastroenterology, Pneumothysiology and Emergency Surgery, will be given by the best Professors of the Faculty of Medicine of the National Autonomous University of Mexico City.

Besides these, subjects of a technical character will be given, such as Wine making, Vine - culture, Mineral Raw Materials, and others, as well as Courses on physic-chemical, and physic mathematic Sciences.

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CHARACTER OF THE COURSES. — It has been agreed to divide them in Courses of Professional Perfectioning and courses for irregular students although the alumni assisting to them may be mixed.

In the former, the studies of the student will be taken in consideration, and he will be required to present some works at the end of the cycle, and will receive a diploma, points, and assistance notes.

The irregular student will have a right to assistance notes.

Complementary Data. The Summer School will be inaugurated Monday, July 21 and will end on Friday, August 22.

The School Office will give students the lists of subjects, bibliographies and time tables for each course, as well as the special catalogues edited for the most outstanding activities (Exposition of Pre-Spanish Art, Exposition "Saturnino Herrán", etc.)

The entrance fee per course is \$25.00 Mexican Currency, or its equivalent in other countries.
