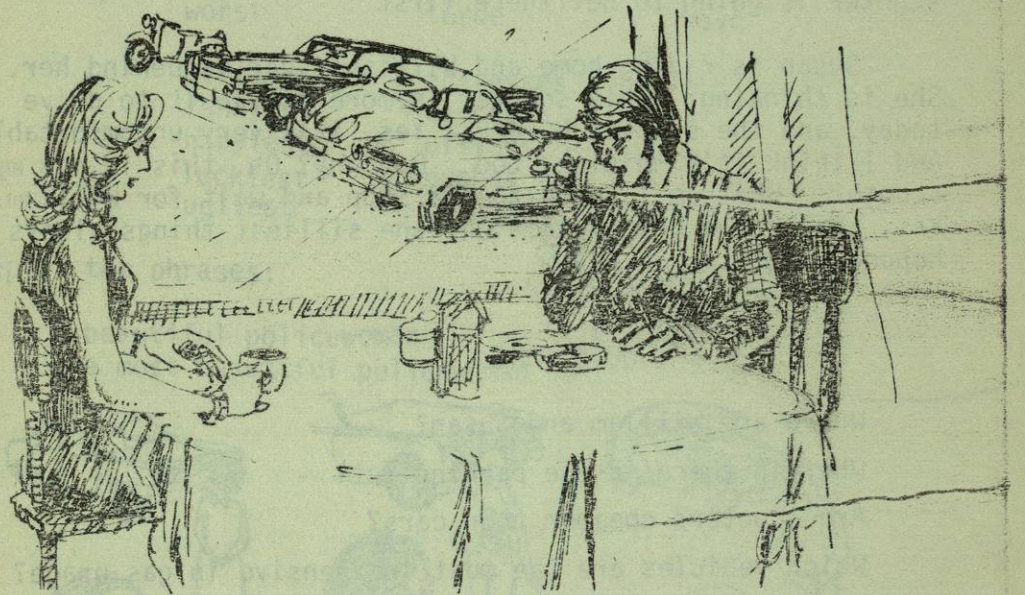

A CAR OR A SCOOTER

And I think it's noisier, too. But why? Oh, this is not my scooter! What am I going to do? Stop and wait for William. Yes, that's the best idea. Oh, the silliest things always happen to me".
