It has been asserted that the *Pilgrim's Progress* is, in the main, pilfered from a Catholic work of the fifteenth century.

§The full title is, "Historical Memoirs of the English, Irish, and Scottish Catholics since the Reformation." It is in four volumes.

[†]Chatterton died in his eighteenth year. He is the youngest author holding a place in English letters; but he was an erratic and unfortunate genius.

†Froude is a very unsafe authority. His style is elegant, but his statements are often so twisted and colored that they must be received with a wise caution.

"When Mr. Froude is most *inaccurate*," says the historian Freeman, "when he is most *thoroughly ignorant* of the subject on which he writes, he still writes with an air of quiet confidence which is likely to take in all whose own studies have not qualified them to answer him. It is because the air of confidence is so quiet that it is so dangerous. Never, surely, did a false prophet succeed so thoroughly in putting on the outward garb of the true."—*Contemporary Review*, 1878.

Froude's *History of England* is in twelve volumes, and extends from the fall of Wolsey to the death of Elizabeth.
