CAPUT II.

DE CONCILII ECCLESIASTICIS.

128. Concilium latine, Synodus græce, idem est, ac plurium in unum locum, alicujus rei tractandæ gratia, conventus. A Personis tractantibus æque ac Rebus tractandis, aliud civile est ac politicum, aliud Ecclesiasticum. Posterior species præsentis capitis est argumentum; in quo præmissis, quæ ad Concilia universim spectant, de œcumenici concilii conditionibus agetur, adjecta simul brevi quadam celebratorum Conciliorum notitia.
