Glasgow. Thursday, 31st Dec. 1892.

To-morrow, being New Year's Day, will be observed as a general holiday in both the wholesale and retail trades, and in some cases business will not be resumed until Monday. On the first three days of this week orders were being freely booked, but since then a holiday feeling has pervaded the markets. There were light arrivals of Scotch Cheese, but, as the sale is still very small, stocks continue large. Quotations are unaltered and weak, except for fancy brands, which, being rather scarce, are firm-Wilts 56s to 70s, Cheddars 56s to 65s, and Dunlops 52s to 62s. Summer-made American cheeses are getting into smaller compass locally, but prices are steady at 48s to 50s; September makes are firmer at 52s to 54s. American Bacon is in moderate demand at firm rates. Irish fresh bacon has been more freely offered during the past day or two, but prices are nominally the same as before, viz., 54s to 56s. Irish hams sell briskly at 74s to 82s. Owing to the mild weather the demand is quiet. Canned Goods are dull, but quotations steady. Irish bladder Lard sells freely at 50s to 54s. Eggs are advancing in price.
