BULK DUTY.

Office of the Secretary of State, Finance and Public Treasury.—Section 1st.

The President of the Republic has addressed me the following decree:

“MANUEL GONZALEZ, CONSTITUTIONAL PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED MEXICAN STATES, TO THE INHABITANTS OF SAME, GREETING:

“That in accordance with the power vested in the Executive by the Law on Imports, (May 30th ult.) to frame the tariffs corresponding to the new imposts established by said Law, I have deemed proper to decree the following:

“Art 1. From the first of November next, all foreign goods embraced in the nomenclature given below will have to pay on importation through maritime and frontier customhouses, the following bulk duty for every one hundred kilogrammes gross weight:

Art. 2. All articles specified in tariff now in force ewill have to pay on importation, from the first of November prox, besides duties in accordance with said tariff, an additional or bulk duty, in the following proportion.

Art. 3. Crude petroleum and nafta shall pay on importation, from the first of November prox., eighty cents additional or bulk duty on every one undred kilogrammes gross weight, instead of the 88 p^o they nom pay upon invoice value, in accordance with fraction 393 of Tariff.

Art. 4. Foreign goods not specified in tariff now in force, shall pay, from the first of November prox., besides duties caused by importation, in accordance with Art. 21 of said tariff, an additional or bulk duty of seventy-five cents for every one-hundred kilogrammes gross weight.

Art. 5. Bulks embraced in same order, and weighing together less than one-hundred kilogrammes, shall cause the same duty of from fifty to one-hundred cents, in accordance with classification of respective tariff.

Art. 6. When a bulk should contain merchandise causing different bulk duty, this shall be collected by applying to total weight the quota corresponding to merchandise having respectively, the greatest weight.

Art. 7. No bulk duty shall be collected on goods that, by virtue of franchises granted to Railroad companies, and in accordance with determinations of Secretary of Finance should be free of duties.

Art. 8. From the first of November prox., all liquids

mentioned below shall pay, besides the quotas assigned to them by tariff in force, and bulk duty imposed on them by Art. 2 of this decree, the following additional duty *per net kilogram*:

"Art. 9. Construction lumber and cabinet makers' material of all kinds exported through the coast and frontier of the Republic, shall pay, from the 1st of October, 1881, besides duties in conformity with fraction IX, Art. 78 of tariff now in force, an additional duty of one dollar for each ton of a cubic metre.

"Art. 10. Construction lumber and cabinet makers' material coming from foreign countries on transit through rivers and ports of the Republic, shall pay on exportation, as an only duty, from the 1st of October 1881, four dollars and eighty cents per ton of cubic metre.

This disposition does not apply to the transit of foreign lumber through railroads whose management has had contracts with the Mexican Government with stipulations upon transit.

"Art. 11. In all liquidations formed by maritime and frontier customhouses of duties caused by foreign merchandise on importation, there shall be placed in a separate column the value of bulk duties, and of the additional upon liquids established by this decree.

"Ordered printed, published, circulated, and that due compliance be given to same.

"Given at the Federal Palace, City of Mexico, June 25, 1881.—*Manuel Gonzalez*.—To the Secretary of State, Finance and Public Treasury, Francisco de Landero y Cos."
