For rates to place on the Continent of Europe, Asia, Africa and South America, other than those on this tariff, charge the Company's rate to London, and the rate beyond London, as per general tariff Book.

For rates to places in Cuba, other than Havana, charge this Company's rate to Havana and that of the Cuba Submarine Company or the Cuba Government lines, as the case may be, to destination.

For the West India Islands and British Guiana charge this Company's rate to Havana and that of the Cuba Submarine Company to destination.

All telegrams sent by the Executive of Mexico to his public functionareis abroad, or those that may be addressed to him by them, shall be trasmitted free of all charge over the cable of the Mexican Telegraph Company.



On all telegrams from inland Mexican Government Telegraph offices, must be added 57 cts. for a message of ten words or less, date, address and signature free, and 6 cts. for each extra word.

When the "per word" rate be used, 6 cts. should be charged for each word.

From all points in Mexico on State or private lines beyond Government offices, the State or private line rate must be included in addition to Government rate.

On all telegrams to or from inland Mexican Government Telegraph offices, must be added \$ 0.57 for a message of ten words or less, and \$ 0.06 for each extra word.

To and from all points in Mexico on State or private lines beyond Government offices, the State or private line rate must be included in addition to Government rate.

A reduction of 50 p<sup>o</sup> will be made on the above rates on all telegrams to and from the President of the Republic and the Secretaries of State, on official business.

The above tariff is exclusively for telegrams destined for the points named, and managers of all offices must decline to accept any telegram when, in their judgment, such telegram is intended for points for which the tariff for foreign telegrams should be charged.

## UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE.

Telegrams to all points in México, where there are Government Telegraph Stations, will be transmitted and delivered by the Government lines.

Telegrams to and from points beyond the lines of the Government, will be transmitted by the State or private lines connected with the Government lines.
